Prevalence of Gambling: Tuscarawas & Carroll Counties and Ohio

- An estimated 7,618 Tuscarawas and Carroll county adult residents can be categorized as low-risk, moderate-risk, or problem gamblers; 8.1% of the general adult population. Statewide, the percentage is 10.3% of the general adult population.
- The prevalence of problem gambling in Tuscarawas and Carroll counties is 0.4%, which equates to an estimated 347 individuals in the target population of 93,811 (18 years and older).

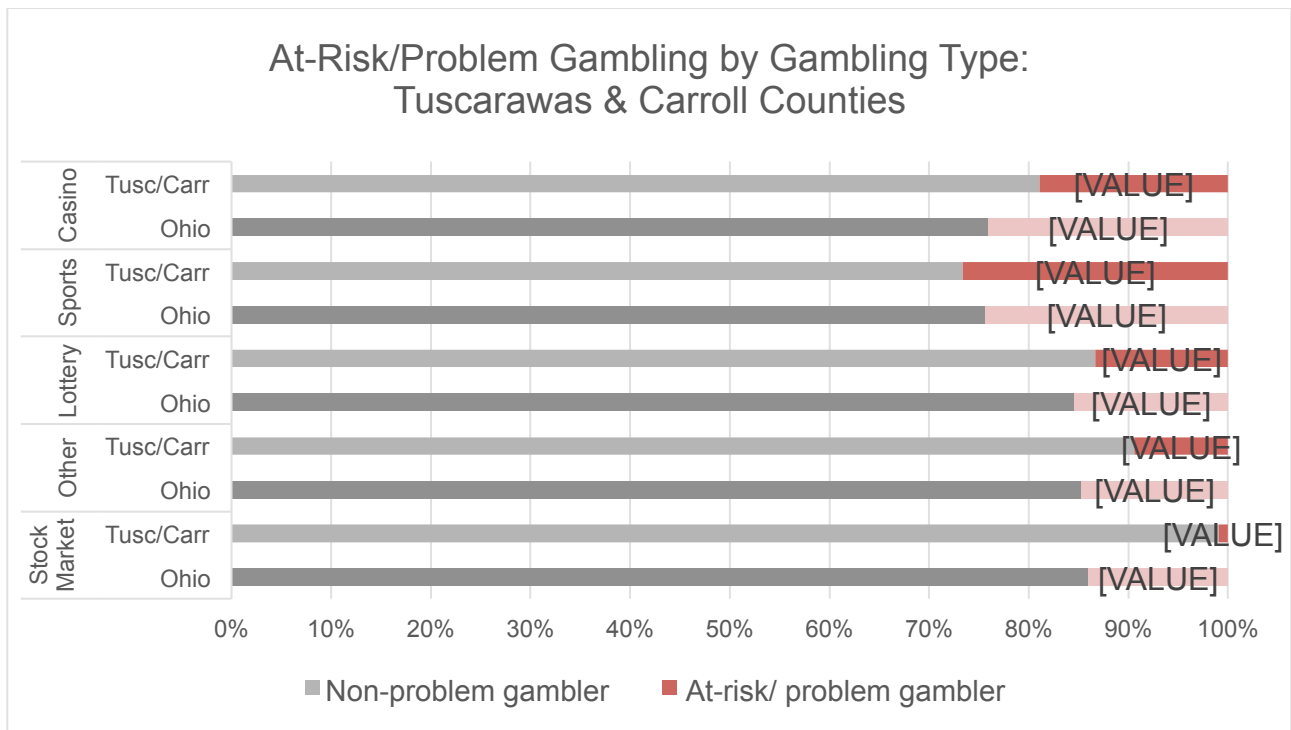

*"Other race" comprised Asian, American Indian and Alaska Native, Native Hawaiian and Pacific Islander, Other, and more than one race.

- Overall, men had a higher rate of at-risk/problem gambling than women. However, this varied in different age groups. Among adults 25-44 and 65 and over, men had higher rates of at-risk/problem gambling than women. Among adults 18-24 and 45-64, women had higher rates than men.
- Because of the low numbers of African American and "Other race" individuals, these categories were combined for analysis. White individuals had a higher rate of at-risk/problem gambling than African American and "Other race" individuals.
- Young adults (18-24) had the highest rate of at-risk/problem gambling; twice the rate of adults 25-44.
- Older adults (65+) had the highest rate of abstaining from gambling.

*"Other" gambling includes: betting on card and board games with family and friends; raffle/fundraising tickets; bingo; arcade/video games; gaming machines (non-casino); Internet café gambling, and Internet gambling (non-café). The participation rate for Other types of gambling may be due to the many diverse activities in this category.



- Sports gamblers had the highest rate of at-risk/problem gambling (26.6%), followed by Casino gamblers (18.9%).
- Statewide, the at-risk/problem gambling rate for Sports gambling was lower. The rates for Casino, Lottery, Stock Market, and other gambling were higher (especially Stock Market gambling).
